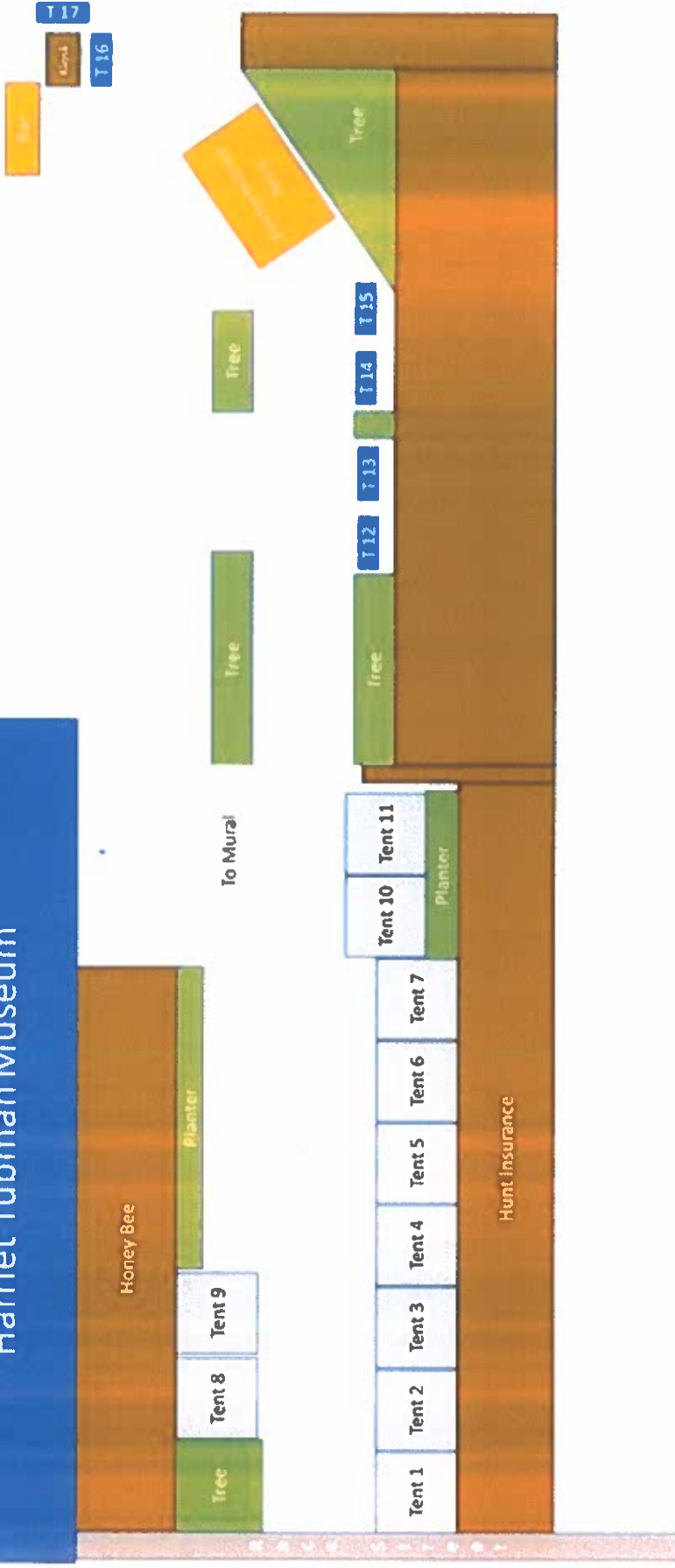

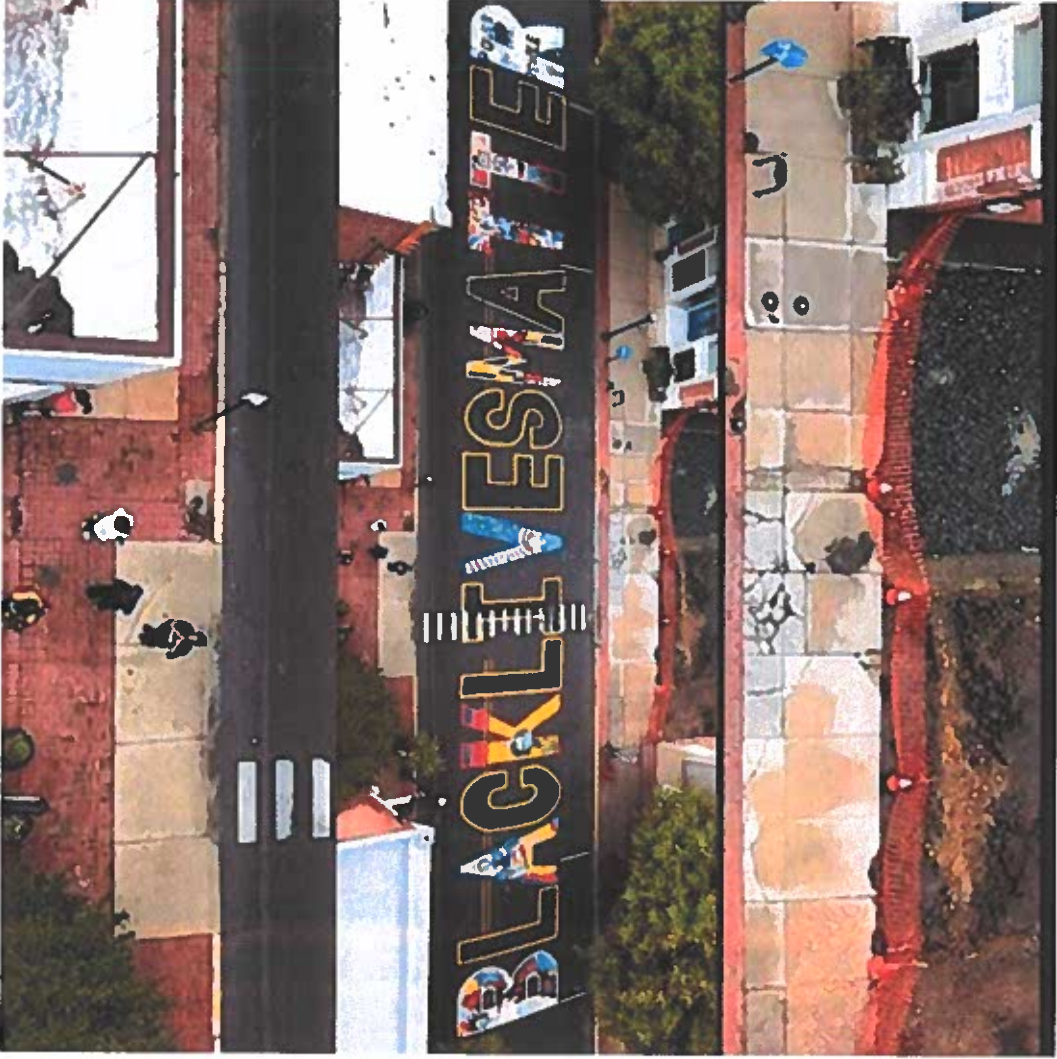

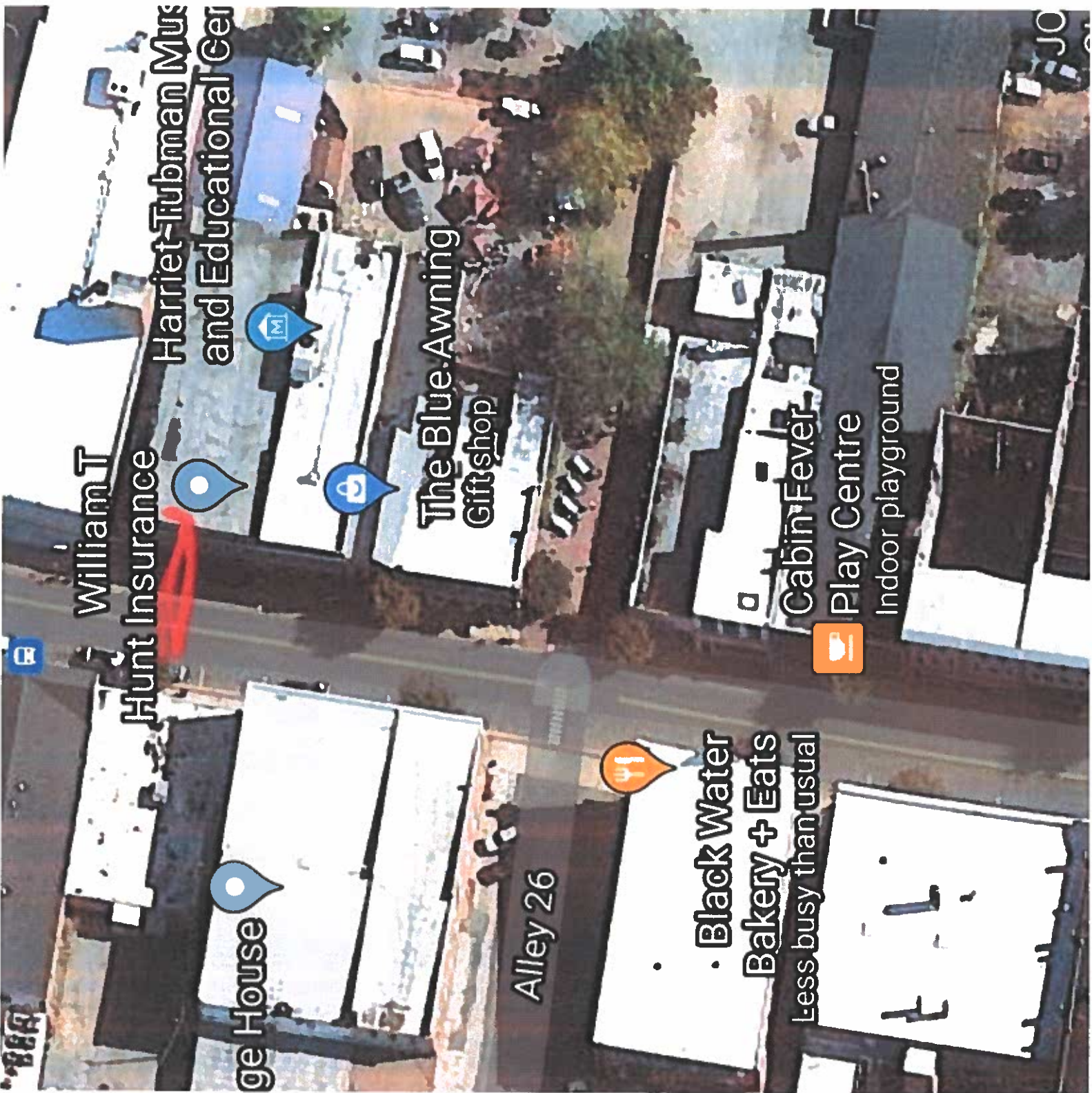

Hello Business Neighbors,

Greetings from Alpha Genesis CDC (AGCDC), we are the owners of 428- 432 Race Street; our offices will be permanently located on the second floor of the building, once our renovation project is complete. In 2020, after the murder of George Floyd, AGCDC and Dorchester Center for the Arts sponsored the installation the Black Lives Matter street mural on the 400 block of Race Street, under the direction of Artists Miriam Moran and Shelton Hawkins. Last year on Juneteenth, we retouched the mural again... some of the images were changed; we added Amanda Gorman. After the tragic death of A-Corrie Young this past week, we decided that we will be back again to retouch the mural and continue the conversation.

Artist, Miriam Moran will host several teenagers from the Baltimore and Cambridge-Boys and Girls Clubs to talk about what "Black Lives Matter" means to them while re-painting the mural;; our Cambridge community is always invited to participate. If you would like to be a part of this event or contribute in any way, please respond to this message.

For this one-day Juneteenth event, AGCDC will request that 400 block of Race Street be closed on Saturday June 18, 2022 at 10 am to 10 pm (from the LMS mission bldg. to Muir Street). This gives us time to prep, paint and let the paint dry. Parking for your businesses on that day will be available via the side streets and back parking lots. There will be vendors in Cannery Way and performances at the Harriet Tubman mural. We will submit a special event request to the city at the next council meeting on Monday, April 25, 2022. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns about this event. If we do not hear from you, we will assume that you are aware of this event and are in agreement to the proposed street closure.

We find that this is one public art event that continues to grow and evolve, We are honored to be able to facilitate this platform where our community comes together to intentionally learn more about race relations, history and the healing of public art.
