Recommendation: That Council;

A. Approve staff's request to have Council show support for ESLC efforts to help raise money for Cannery Park with their grant application.

Discussion: ESCL is preparing a grant application to Robert Wood Johnson Foundation: People, Parks, and Power: A National Initiative for Green Space, Health Equity, and Racial Justice. ESLC has been our partner on this project from the very beginning and in their continuing efforts are applying for this grant which has the following purpose statement:

"The People, Parks, and Power initiative comes at a critical moment. Imbalances in political and economic power and a legacy of racial discrimination in the conservation movement have excluded groups led by people of color from full participation in park and green space work or have tokenized their involvement. The P3 initiative is grounded in the premise that urban parks are essential community infrastructure that should serve every neighborhood in a fair, just, and safe manner, without displacing longtime residents or community-serving businesses. P3 will support communitybased organizations and base-building groups working in urban, low-income communities of color across the United States to increase park equity through local policy and systems change. The geographic focus of the P3 initiative is urban areas—with a particular interest in small and midsized cities (under 500,000 population)."
