Those attending also likely got to see that Phase One of the Waterfront Promenade is more than half complete. The promenade is the first public amenity of the overall project and will serve as the pedestrian access pathway along the length of the property adjacent to the Choptank River. It will connect with the wharf and is projected to be open to the public in late summer.

As that construction work continues, the Waterfront Park open space is available for use now. Community members are invited to use the area for informal activities like dog walking, picnics, kite flying, and more. In the meantime, CWDI's volunteer board is now fully seated with the addition last month of a final City of Cambridge appointee, Bernard Brathwaite. Each jurisdiction appoints members to CWDI's seven-member all volunteer Board of Directors.
