**Barricade Situation / Warrant Service – 12-19-25** – On 12-19-25, at approximately 9:23pm, CPD Officers and members of the Dorchester County Sheriff's Office K9 Unit responded to the 500 block of Glenburn Ave in reference to attempting to serve an active warrant on a Delorenze Rushaan Dukes (30 years old from Cambridge, MD). Dukes had an active extraditable warrant out of DE for Stalking, Harassment and multiple counts of felony Breach of the Peace. Upon officers' arrival at the apartment complex, they located a vehicle that Dukes had been operating. Officers attempted to contact Dukes at the apartment door where he could be heard inside but was failing to come to the door. Officers also could hear what appeared to be furniture being moved around inside of the apartment. Officers continued to contact Dukes through communication at the door to have him surrender to Police, which he was failing to do. Officers were able to confirm that Dukes was inside of the apartment as he had called 911, which plotted his location at the apartment. Officers on the outside of the apartment building also observed Dukes come to a rear window and then duck out of view.

Officers had multiple tenants of surrounding apartments vacate their apartments to a safe location within the apartment building until the situation was resolved. Officers on location still attempted to communicate with Dukes to resolve the issue for a period of time. Members of the Cambridge Police Department Special Tactical Response Team (STRT), Cambridge Police Department Criminal Investigation

Division (CID), and CPD Drone Unit were called in and responded to the scene.

CPD CID obtained a Search and Seizure Warrant for the apartment for the apprehension of Dukes, which was executed at approximately 11:57pm. After the apartment was breached, CPD Drone Unit deployed an interior drone into the apartment locating Dukes laying face down on a bed. Officers were able to establish communication through the Drone with Dukes and ordering him to exit the apartment with his hands up, which he complied. Dukes was then placed under arrest and transported to the Cambridge Police Department for processing and his initial appearance before a Court Commissioner. Dukes was later turned over to the Dorchester County Department of Corrections on a temporary commitment. Dukes was charged with the following:

- Fugitive from Justice Out of Delaware
- Failure to Obey Lawful Order
- Obstruct and Hindering
- Resisting Arrest
- Disturbing the Peace
